The Registered Inspector will provide a draft feedback to me and the Senior Team on Wednesday 9th April. That day he will also meet with governors for a presentation of the inspectors' findings. The full and final report will not be available until next term. I should be able to provide you with the summary with my next newsletter.

I wish to take this opportunity to thank you, the parents for your support (over 50% of you returned the questionnaire, which is exceptional) and for the positive feedback you provided. I have already thanked the girls in assembly, they rose to the occasion and helped to show the best that we can be and of course the staff for whom an inspection is always stressful. However, they received such positive feedback from their lesson observations that they did enjoy it in the end! The whole process demonstrated how well we all work together as a team, students, staff, parents and governors.

As reported last term, the school debating team won through to the 2^{nd} round of the premier schools' debating competition, the Cambridge Union. They were again required to travel down to Tunbridge Wells, where they were competing against the best debating teams in the area. The motion to be debated was 'This House would not trade with dictatorships', a fairly topical motion considering event in Iraq and Zimbabwe at the moment. The team of Laura West and Ellie Clarke, were not allowed to know their debating side or position until 15 minutes before the event started, and were in the end relieved to be drawn as the first opposition team. The debate was lively throughout and by the end of this first stage, there was not much separating the competitors. The teams were then given 15 minutes to prepare a debate on the motion 'This House would elect the Lords', again a most topical motion. The ensuing arguments were varied, and led to a confident performance by the GGSG team. However, in the end only one team can go through to the finals day at the Cambridge Union and sadly the judge decided that Tunbridge

Wells Girls Grammar were the best team on the night. It was a most enjoyable evening and Laura and Ellie should be congratulated for their level of commitment and expertise to have got so far in the competition.

Free School Meals

Kent County Council has asked me to remind you that any parent/child who is in receipt of Income Support/Job Seekers Allowance or is an Asylum Seeker qualifies for free school meals. However, with effect from 6th April 2003, regulatory changes also permit any parent who is in receipt of a <u>Child Tax</u> <u>Credit</u> (but not Working Tax Credit) and whose annual income does not exceed £13,230 to be eligible for free school meals as well. Further information is provided on the attached sheet published by KCC. Forms are available from the Main Office. Please be assured that all related matters are dealt with discreetly.

Examinations Reminder

The girls have worked very hard this year and we wish them all the very best in their revision period and in the examinations over the coming weeks.

At this time I feel it important that you are made aware of the boards' policy with regards to mobile phones. Any candidate who is found to be in possession of a mobile phone is considered by the Board to be "in breach of Board regulations". This means that the Examination Boards have the right to cancel the candidate's examination and also reserve the right to review any other examination(s) they have taken with the Board in the current examination season. Girls are made fully aware of this but I feel it is important that you are also aware of the serious consequences of taking a mobile phone into an examination room. We are however, unable to take responsibility for mobile phones left outside examination rooms and therefore advise students to leave their mobiles at home. Girls will be fully briefed in relation to the arrangements for examinations. Should you have any worries please contact the school office.

Invigilators

Following our success last year, the School will be using people from outside the teaching staff to assist with external examinations invigilation. We need people between 12^{th} May and 27^{th} June and expect to pay not less than £5 per hour.
