Debating



The autumn term is always a busy one for debating and the last few weeks have been just that for the school Debating Team. On Thursday 27th November they were drawn against King's School, Rochester in the 1st Round of the ESU Mace Debating Competition. The event took place at Dartford Girls and we were asked to oppose the motion 'This House would give all cities elected mayors.' The standard of Debate was high, with the experienced Toni Atkinson (U6KS) and Becky Drewry (L6NM) putting forward a balanced and convincing opposition. They were convincing enough to not only win the vote on their motion, but also to go through to the next round of the competition in the New Year. It must be said that along the way the team has taken the noticeable Debating scalp of Newstead Woods School for Girls, something that has not been achieved before by a GGSG team in seven years of trying.



Monday 1st December saw the same pairing participating in the Cambridge Union Parliamentary Debate competition, along with teams from Dartford Girls and Benenden. The standard of Debate was very high, with the team showing a great deal of insight and structure in the way that they put forward their cases for the two motions; 'This House would make the unemployed work for the dole', and 'This House would legalise prostitution'. The latter of the two motions was something that they were only given 15minutes to prepare. In the end, the team was not selected to go through to next term's further heat. However, the experience gained will benefit the team for the quest for success in the ESU competition.

Family Holidays & School Attendance

We continue to be concerned at the number of families who take holidays in school time. Whilst we have to accept that some parents have no alternative because of professional commitments, I must stress once again how disruptive absence can be to your daughter's education. May I ask you therefore that such absences are kept to the bare minimum, due notice be given and work collected by your daughter from her teachers <u>prior</u> to the holiday.

With the January tests fast approaching, we would encourage all students to use this strategy alongside their usual methods of revision. Additionally, students in Years 8 to 13 have undergone an assessment to have their preferred learning styles identified. This information should now be inside students' planners together with some suggestions for strategies that match each of the learning styles.
