Dear Parents

Science College

As you know we have been designated a Specialist Science College from September 2004. This will mean many improvements for your daughters: new and refurbished Science facilities, better ICT facilities across the school and a range of additional equipment and resources. In addition focussed activities in Science, Maths and other subjects will prepare your daughter more effectively for the scientific world in which we live. Mr McCorkell has been appointed Science College Director from September. He will keep you updated with developments and will be inviting you to participate in the community events we organise in the future.

Building Project

The demolition of the Physics "hut" will have started by the time you read this - the building programme itself will begin on Monday 26th July after we have broken up for the summer break. The anticipated date of completion is 28th February. A well-defined building compound will be set up with priority given to the health and safety of the students, staff and visitors. A temporary building will be erected at the front of the school by the annex to accommodate the temporary Library before it is moved to the refurbished Biology Labs.

It is crucial to minimise traffic on the site and we therefore ask you <u>not</u> to drive onto the main site at any time except of course if you are collecting your sick daughter.

Changes to Key Stage 3 curriculum, September 2004 onwards

In order to meet statutory curriculum requirements in delivering ICT, Governors have agreed to make the following changes:

- In Year 7: 1 weekly period of D&T will be replaced by ICT.
- In Year 8: the fortnightly period of Latin will be replaced by ICT.

- In Year 9: the fortnightly period of Drama will be replaced by ICT.
- From September 2005 the fortnightly period of Latin will be replaced by a period of PE as the school does not currently meet the recommended 2 hours per week.

Drama will revert to being taught as part of the English curriculum. However, it is our intention also to provide opportunities for the students to experience Drama as an extra-curricular activity. Mrs Rosenthal will run an after-school Drama Club. If members are high, priority will be given initially to Year 9 students.

Miss Vamplew is also looking into an e-learning Latin course, which could be introduced on the school network.

National Schools Partnership

You will have received a letter from the National Schools Partnership via the School in mid-June. You will know, therefore, that in addition to providing some income for the School, the Partnership hopes to promote the cause of environmental and ethical consumerism.

The first letter from them introduced InkXpress and their scheme for refilling computer printer cartridges at greatly reduced costs. The Partnership were at pains to say that 40 million used cartridges accumulate in Britain every year, filling landfill sites and wasting increasingly valuable oil resources.

Should anyone require additional pre-paid envelopes for posting their ink cartridges for refilling, they can be obtained from Mr Jones at the School.

Athletics

In the Kent Championships on 15th and 16th May, three girls had success.

Rebecca Saunders broke the U17 Discus record by 500m, winning a Gold medal, throwing 40m 83cm. She was interviewed by Radio Kent and competes for England next Friday 16th July against Scotland, Ireland and Wales. Congratulations Rebecca!

Hayley Hickmott came second in the U15 800m final with a personal best time of 2m 24 seconds.

Rosalind Seeley took part in the U15 Long Jump, High Jump, Discus, Javelin and 75m Hurdles events. In the Hurdles final she came 5th in a time of 12.74 seconds. Rosalind is now ranked in the top ten in the country in Discus in her age group, for her personal best throw of 39m 97. Well done!

Rebecca and Rosalind were selected for the English Schools Championships to represent Kent on the 8th and 9th July.

The Years 7 and 8 Athletics team and Years 9 and 10 team have taken part in the District League matches this term. Results will be available next term.

Music



We recently held the Junior Concert in which the style of music was varied and the standard of performance was very high. The Training Orchestra, Clarinet Ensemble and Wind Band performed music ranging from Gershwin's 'Summertime' to a selection from the musical 'Me and My Girl'. A high number of Key Stage 3 students were keen to show off their talents with solos and duets this year and those who performed in the concert had successfully auditioned. Performances included a piano duet by Abigail Alfrey and Amelia Hook (7BR), an Oboe solo by Sophie Matthews (7TP) and a vocal solo by Melanie Nurdin (8AW). From September we will be running Theory classes which are open to anyone of Grade 3 and above on their instrument, who has not yet taken the Grade 5 examination. The classes we are offering are free of charge. If students wish to take the examination then parents will need to pay the entry fee, as per practical examinations. Classes take place every Thursday lunchtime in Room 47. Anyone who is interested should let Miss Sayers know.

There are vacancies for tuition in most instruments and singing in September. If you would like your daughter to begin lessons, she should see Miss Sayers for the appropriate application form. Shared lessons of two or more students dramatically reduces the cost.

Uniform



Our supplier has asked me to remind you that the kilts should not be tumble dried as it damages the pleats and the leather straps. Please also note that the kilts must not be washed in hot water (maximum 40°) - leather straps will no longer be replaced free of charge after 6 months of wear. The kilts have been getting gradually shorter, please ensure your daughter returns in September with the appropriate length of kilt.

Mobile Phone Mast

I have received the pre-consultation on behalf of T-Mobile Limited for a Telecommunications Installation comprising one 11.7m high slimline Monopole with 3 antennas contained within a glass reinforced plastic shroud, one 0.3m diameter microwave dish, radio equipment housing and ancillary development in the courtyard of R B Hammond, May Avenue Industrial Estate, Perry Street, Northfleet, Kent. The cell is centred on two mini roundabouts at the junction of Pelham Road South, Old Road West and Pelham Road.

In response to the 'Stewart Report', the government has stated that emissions from radio base stations should meet the International Commission on Non-Ionizing Radiation Protection (ICNIRP) guidelines for public exposure adopted in the UK. They can confirm that the proposed installation will comply with these guidelines. In fact, because of the very low power utilised by telecommunications sites the

emissions will be many times lower than the ICNIRP threshold.


