#### Dear Parents

This half term has flown by as students have been focusing on their examinations. Year 9 had their first taste of public examinations and deserve to be congratulated on their mature approach. A number of them had taken advantage of the additional Mathematics and Science revision sessions offered to them during the Easter break. Thank you to Mr Garner, Miss Sivaji, Mrs Thompson, Mrs Dalton and Mr Singh for coming in during their holidays. Year 11, 12 and 13 have entered one of the busiest periods of their education. We all wish them the success they deserve. Whilst they are at home revising they must not forget that their teachers can still be of help if they need to check out any information.

# Water

No doubt you will be aware how much has been said in the media about the importance of a regular water intake for all of us. Schools have received much information about the role we should play in encouraging our students to drink water throughout the day. Apart from the health problems associated with lack of water, we have a vested interest in ensuring that our students' minds are sufficiently hydrated to maximise their learning capabilities. Evidence shows that students who drink water regularly throughout the day are able to concentrate better and longer. We are advised that small amounts throughout the day are better than large amounts less frequently. We have reminded your daughters that it is perfectly acceptable for them to take a small drink of water out of a bottle during a lesson. There are exceptions to this, girls are not allowed to have a drink in the Library, the ICT Rooms or the Science Labs, they must be sensible and have a drink **before** they enter these areas. We ask that they do not abuse this by bringing other types of drink. Water alone is allowed in lessons.

In addition to the water fountains we have in toilets and changing room areas we are having a fresh water dispenser installed in the Dining Room where girls can fill up the bottles they bring to school. Mineral water is also on sale in the drinks machines (we are planning to phase out sweet, fizzy drinks, but the girls will be consulted through the School Council).

#### Extra Curricular Activities

#### **Regional Final of the Mathematics Challenge**

Four girls took part in the challenge at King's College in London before the Easter break. The competition comprised of four rounds of challenging mathematical activities, our team actually came second in one of these rounds. Overall out of 18 other schools we came 9<sup>th</sup>. The girls who took part were Emily Banks, Ashani Biswas, Laura Humphreys and Stephanie Tann. Well done! Thank you to Miss Pulver for organising this.

#### German Exchange

During the Easter holidays 34 students accompanied by four members of staff enjoyed an exchange trip to Neumunster, Germany. Klaus-Groth Schule, our partner school for the past 16 years. Everyone adapted well to the 'German way of life', taking in similarities as well as differences in the school system, food, leisure activities and local traditions.

During their stay they visited the Hanseatic City of



Hamburg and took a boat trip round the international harbour and enjoyed a guided tour through the famous 'Rathaus'. The Easter weekend started with a walking tour through the old town and then joined their host families for Easter celebrations, which included an Easter egg hunt 'German Style' and a visit to a traditional Easter bonfire.

The experience also included a trip to Lubeck, a UNESCO World Heritage Town since 1987 and the farewell party which was organised brought their exchange visit to an enjoyable end. The girls agreed that they had experienced a wonderful time and benefited socially, culturally and linguistically from the trip. The accompanying staff were pleased by the girls' good conduct throughout their stay. We are now looking

Every pupil managed the walk and they all learned a great deal from this training weekend and are now ready to go on their practice expedition where they will this time, be walking without an adult leader and will have to make all the decisions themselves. Altogether their were 12 trainers/assessors on this training weekend and it was very pleasing to hear at least 5 of them say how wonderful it was to work with our girls and how attentive they had been.
